Currently we are blessed to care for 30 children, 21 older children and 9 infants. Due to a generous grant from the Florence Martin Foundation we are constructing 4 reading nooks and filling them with Spanish language books to help the children on their road to literacy. The books and comfortable seating will provide quiet comfortable places to read for pleasure. Providing the children with intellectual and social stimulation is a key part of their development and staff at Casa Hogar La Gloria are excited about this new addition. On a recent trip a visit to the nursery became a book club of a whole different kind. Each of the toddlers picked a book and a high school volunteer and spent as much time as they could learning new words and teaching Spanish to the high school volunteers.

Another addition to the infrastructure are new washers and dryers from the Coronado/ Point Loma Rotary Club. You can imagine how much laundry 30 children make and add a little rain and dirt and the task is formidable. The new washers and dryers will free up the staff for quality time with the children.

In the fall efforts were made to identify and plan to prepare for “El Nino.” The staff arranged for two large trees by the entrance to be removed and for additional supports to be added to the foundations under the nursery area. Emergency exits have been improved and drainage has been reviewed and cleaned up. The fall clean up also included a bit of bartering with other orphanages near by. The staff realized that we had a surplus of clothing for older children and rather than have it sit in storage they traded and donated the items.

Nowhere has it been truer for me than in my monthly visits to Hogar. A game of soccer or a shared meal are such simple things, but it is the wonderful simple things that form lasting impressions and positive effects on the lives of children.

Since coming to Saints, all of my friends who have made Hogar a frequent part of their lives agree that it is one of the most rewarding experiences available to the students. The grace which we experience on our visits and the joy and sustenance the children receive with our arrival are things both of us desperately need.
